The program in Research, Evaluation, Measurement, and Statistics (REMS) in the Department of Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology at the University of Georgia is pleased to announce a tenure-track position to be filled at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. This position is for a scholar whose research focuses on structural equation modeling or advanced multivariate statistics. We are particularly interested in a scholar whose program of research uses and develops model-based statistical methods for the study of complex behavioral and educational phenomena. This position requires teaching the equivalent of two courses per semester in the REMS program area. The successful candidate will be a member of the REMS faculty with a tenure home in the Department of Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology.

Qualifications include an earned doctorate at the time of employment with a specialization in Educational Statistics, Quantitative Psychology, Educational Measurement or a closely related field, a record of scholarly research in an area relevant to the REMS program, and the potential for obtaining external research funding. Additional responsibilities of this position include maintaining an active research program, mentoring students and directing theses and dissertations, seeking external funding, and participating in faculty governance.

Strong quantitative and computer skills along with superior organizational and interpersonal skills are essential.
