Responsibilities will be to develop and maintain an independent program of research in quantitative psychology, to supervise quantitative graduate students, to teach graduate and undergraduate quantitative courses, and to work with a growing group of quantitative faculty to provide consultation that enhances the statistical sophistication of research, grants, and dissertations in a wide range of psychological and educational topics. Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Preference will be given to applicants who have demonstrated both strong research productivity and outstanding teaching performance. Applicants should submit a letter addressing their qualifications, a full curriculum vita, and three letters references.
