

QUANTITATIVE PSYCHOLOGY/BEHAVIORAL GENOMICS

The Department of Psychology, College of Science at The University of Texas at Arlington is seeking to fill a tenure-track Assistant Professor Faculty position beginning Fall 2011.

Candidates should complement and strengthen the current areas of the Program. We are looking for a scientist with research interests and experience in the behavioral, molecular and/or statistical aspects of the genetics of health problems and behavior. We are especially interested in individuals who can use advanced quantitative methodologies for the multivariate and structural equation modeling analyses of data in health, informatics, epidemiology, genomics, psychoneuroimmunology, and psychophysiology.

In addition to research and graduate supervision (M.S. and Ph.D.), the successful applicant will be expected to teach graduate and/or undergraduate courses, and engage in productive research activities. The Department strongly encourages interdisciplinary research, and has active intra-institutional collaborations with the Departments of Biology, Chemistry/Biochemistry, Kinesiology, Biomedical Engineering and the College of Nursing, as well as inter-institutional collaborations with The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas, The University of Texas at Dallas, and The University of North Texas Health Sciences Center in Fort Worth. All four Universities are located in the growing Dallas-Fort Worth Metroplex region of North Central Texas.
