

QUANTITATIVE METHODOLOGIST, Tenure-Track Position, Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, Blacksburg, VA.

The Department of Psychology (<http://www.psyc.vt.edu>) and College of Science (<http://www.cos.vt.edu>) at Virginia Tech are seeking to hire a tenure-track faculty member in the area of QUANTITATIVE RESEARCH METHODS, as part of a university-wide focus on health and developmental science. This position is subject to final budgetary approval. Candidates in all areas of quantitative psychology will be considered, with preference given to those specializing in analytical approaches which complement current strengths in the department including health, biological, clinical, developmental, industrial/organizational, and social-personality psychology. The department recognizes the need to have a core of faculty who specialize in methodology, statistics, assessment, and modeling to continue growing as a nationally recognized leader in research. This position will continue hiring intended to create synergy across areas within the department and across departments within the university by building our quantitative research expertise. In addition to conducting quantitative research the appointee will be expected to teach basic and advanced courses in quantitative methods related to her/his area of expertise. This position was approved at the assistant professor level, but dependent on qualifications, a higher rank may be considered.
